Topics for speaking engagements

I enjoy speaking to professionals or to the community on a variety of psychological and neuropsychological issues, including neurological or neurocognitive disorders (dementia, traumatic brain injury, concussions, etc.), ADHD and learning disorders, memory, legal issues such as neuropsychology in legal evaluations (neuropsychology in aid & assist, competence, diminished capacity, sanity, disability, etc.), and general psychological issues.

Qualifications in Neuropsychology

I completed graduate level coursework in Sensation & Perception, Physiological Psychology, Human Neuropsychology, Neuropsychological Testing, Cognition, Psychopathology, and Psychological Tests & Measures. I completed 10 graduate units of independent study in the area of neuropsychology, emphasizing Luria's neuropsychological model of the brain, cognitive neuroscience, and hemispheric lateralization. I completed 4 units of Assessment & Diagnostics Practicum in Neuropsychology. I completed 30 units of Master's and Doctoral level research in neuropsychology, culminating in my dissertation: Hemispheric Asymmetries of Cognitive Processing: Effects of literal and metaphoric language on event-related potentials and alpha power. In several of my training experiences I have been able to emphasize neuropsychology and obtain supervision from neuropsychologists, including my clerkship at Kaiser Mental Health, my internship at Ingleside Hospital, and my work as a pre- and post-doctoral Psychological Assistant at CPC Alhambra Hospital and Las Encinas Hospital. I was able to seek out the neurological patients in these hospitals for experience. Within more than 7000 or hours of supervised experience at the predoctoral and doctoral level, I conservatively estimate I completed 2,500 hours of supervised experience in neuropsychology. Throughout my career, I have utilized a neuropsychological framework in my professional work, have been consistently involved in neuropsychological testing and evaluation with a variety of clinical and forensic patients, and have continued to emphasize neuropsychology in my professional reading and continuing education. I meet the requirements to be considered a neuropsychologist as stated by the National Academy of Neuropsychology, and other professional organizations. I have more recently completed the board certification process with the American Board of Professional Psychology/American Board of Clinical Neuropsychology.
